



form for you to complete upon arrival along with an estimate to review and sign. Once your pet is checked in, we will administer an IV injection of the radio- active isotope. After the injection is administered, a wait time of proximally 2 hours is indicated prior to the scan to allow for uptake of the drug. The patient is then often sedated and a gamma camera is used to obtain images of the patient's skeleton in the areas requested. The areas requested often involve the front half or back half of the patient as determined by the history and the referring veterinarian. Once the images are acquired, Animal Imaging's board-certified radiologists will review images along with your pet's history. Our staff will call you once the procedure is complete and your pet is ready to be picked up. The radiologist report will be completed within 24-48 hours of the procedure and sent to the referring veterinarian, who will then be able to discuss the bone scan findings with you and make any further treatment recommendations.
